John Wesley Dorman, clergy member of the North Mississippi Annual Conference, (b. 1856 d. 1932), joined the Methodist Church with the old Gerezim congregation in Union County, MS, in 1872. He was educated at Blue Mountain Academy and Hiwassee College. He joined the North Mississippi Conference in 1879, was ordained Deacon by Bishop Paine in 1881 and Elder By Bishop McTyeire in 1883. He served the following charges: 1880-81 Horn Lake, 1882 Bolivar, 1883 Jonesboro, 1884 Blackland, 1885-86 Faison and Indianola, 1887-88 Jonestown, 1889-91 Concordia, 1892 Greenville, 1893-95 Starkville, 1896 Oxford, 1897-1900 Greenville District, 1901 Holly Springs, 1902-05 Columbus District, 1906 Starkville, 1907-1910 Lexington, 1911 Itta Bena, 1912-15 Sardis District, 1916-19 Water Valley First Church, 1920-23 Louisville. At the close of 1923, after forty-four years of faithful and efficient service, he was granted the superannuate relation to the Conference. (From 1932 No. Miss. Conference Journal, memoir, page 74)
