George Washington Morris was born in 1798 in Virginia. He was licensed to preach in 1817 in Baltimore Conference. He transferred to the Tennessee Conference in 1820 and was a traveling preacher till 1838. He held appointments in Holston, Abingdon, Lee, Cypress, Lawrence, Stone's River, Goose Creek, and Centreville. In 1838, he was transferred to the Alabama Conference, where he was presiding elder of Batesville. His health made it so could not traveled so located in Helena district until 1850. Then, he was re-admitted to Mississippi Conference where he stayed till his death on December 10, 1853
